February 9, 2022 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join this new virtual romance book club to discuss **"Good Company" by Cynthia D'Aprix Sweeney.** This romance is about a woman who has been happily married for more than 20 years. But, everything she believed is upended when she stumbles upon an envelope containing her husband's wedding ring -- the one he claimed to have lost.

February 17, 2022 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join this virtual history book club to discuss "Say Nothing: A True Story of Murder and Memory in Northern Ireland" by Patrick Radden Keefe. In 1972 Jean McConville, a mother of ten, was dragged from her home by masked intruders as her children clung to her legs. Her children never saw her again. McConville's abduction was one of the most notorious episodes of the armed conflict known as "The Troubles". This book uses what happened to McConville as a starting point for a discussion of a society wracked by a violent war -- a war whose consequences have never been fully reckoned with.

February 23, 2022 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join this virtual book club to discuss **"Malibu Rising" by Taylor Jenkins Reid.** This book transports you to August 1963 as Nina Riva is planning her annual end-of-summer party -- a party that everyone want to attend to see the famous offspring of the legendary singer Mick Riva. But, by the time the party ends and the sun rises on the next morning, the Riva mansion will be destroyed by flames and the secrets and loves that shaped this family for generations will have all come to the surface.

Help Our Community -- Want to do your part to help our community? Here are simple ways you can make a difference:

- (1) Donate Blood -- The COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in a historic nationwide shortage of blood donations. These donations are needed to provide life-saving assistance to people injured in accidents or undergoing life-saving surgery. If you can, please consider donating blood at one of the American Red Cross' blood drives in March. The blood drives are held at the Jersey Coast Chapter of the American Red Cross (1540 West Park Avenue, Tinton Falls, NJ). - (2) Get Your Free At-Home COVID-19 Tests -- Every home in the United States can now order up to FOUR FREE at-home COVID-19 tests from the federal government. The tests are completely free -- there are no shipping costs and you don't need to provide a credit card number. To order your free tests simply go to: https://www.covidtests.gov/

Once the government begins mailing out the test kits, you should expect to receive your order in 7 - 12 days.

(3) Get Boosted -- Booster shots are now approved for individuals ages 12 and older. Everyone 12 years or older should get a booster shot if they received their one-dose Johnson and Johnson vaccine two months ago or if they received their second dose of either the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine FIVE months ago. The recent emergence of the Omicron variant showcases the importance of vaccination, boosters and other preventive efforts to protect yourself and those you love. If you haven't yet scheduled your booster there are several easy ways to find and book an

appointment. The federal government has set up a system that allows you simply to text your zip code to 438829 to find available appointments. You also can locate appointments at www.covid19.nj.gov/finder
