Counselors can help you deal with claims, evaluate health insurance options, apply for financial assistance for prescription plans, etc. All information is confidential. To schedule an appointment for the one-on-one counseling, please call the offices of SHIP at 732-728-1331.

- (4) Tree Preservation -- If you are considering removing a tree on your property be sure to check out the Township of Ocean's Preservation of Trees ordinances first. The policy includes information about required permits and limitations on the number of trees that can be removed. Should you exceed the limitation on the number of trees allowed you are required to replace the trees or pay a fee which benefits the Township of Ocean Shade Tree Fund. The Township of Ocean Preservation of Trees ordinances provides detailed specifications required for replacement trees and the fees that will be assessed if the trees are not replaced. Help Our Community -- Want to do your part to help our community? Here are simple ways you can make a difference

(1) Do Your Part: Conserve -- Did you know that the average American uses about 100 gallons of water per day? With New Jersey still experiencing a persistent drought, which could impact our state's water supply, all residents are being asked to conserve. To help you do your part, our state has put together some helpful tips on how you can help conserve water both inside and outside your home. These tips are available at:

- (2) Get Boosted -- If you haven't already done so, be sure and get the new COVID-19 bivalent booster that offer stronger protections against severe illness and death from the Omicron sub-variants. You can receive this booster as long as it has been two months since your most recent booster or primary vaccination series. The new Pfizer bivalent booster is recommended for all individuals 12 years and older. The new Moderna bivalent booster is recommended for those ages 18 and older. Locations offering the boosters can be found at <a href="https://www.covid19.nj.gov">www.covid19.nj.gov</a>
- (3) Enjoy Some Property Tax Relief -- More than three million NJ residents are eligible for up to \$1,500 in property tax relief under the new ANCHOR program (which replaces the Homestead Rebate Program). To be eligible for this year's ANCHOR benefit, you must have occupied your primary resident on October 1, 2019 and met income limits. You must also file (or be exempt from) NJ income taxes. Payments will be sent out no later than May 2023. Please note: The deadline for filing is December 30, 2022. The state began mailing filing information to residents of Monmouth County on September 23, 2022. You should receive your filing information in early-to-mid October. In the meantime, to find out more about the ANCHOR program, including how benefits are calculated and paid and answers to frequently asked questions, you can
