To ensure that our book sale experience is pleasant for everyone we will have the following policies in place during the sale:

- Doors open at 10:00 a.m. (No early entry)
- Book dealers are welcomed, but hand-held scanners are only allowed on April 2, 2025 and only from 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m
- No hoarding of books or blocking of shelves -- Buyers must not interfere with others' ability to browse.
- Use of the MONITORED HOLDING AREA is mandatory. Once a buyer accumulates more than an armload of books, the books will be labeled with the buyer's name and kept secure until the buyer is ready to check out.
- Absolutely NO sliding books, boxes or bags across the floor.

- (3) Book Club --The Ocean Township Library Book Club will meet on March 6, 2025 at 10:30 a.m. to discuss "The Plot Against America" by Philip Roth. This book takes place in an alternative history -- Charles Lindbergh has defeated Franklin D. Roosevelt in the 1940 presidential election -- and the story follows a young man as he comes of age in New Jersey as antisemitism becomes increasingly more prevalent in American Life. The discussion will be moderated by librarian Adam Rule. Copies of the book are available for pick up at our library's circulation desk. Please note: No registration is required to participate.
- (4) In-person Short Story Discussion -- A short story discussion, moderated by Branch Manager Mary Patterson, will be held on March 13, 2025 at 10:30 a.m. The story is "The Yellow Wallpaper" by Charlotte Perkins Gilman. This story is about a

woman who secretly journals about her experiences being confined to an upstairs bedroom of a summer home while her physician husband is convinced that she will quickly recuperate from what he considers a temporary illness. **Registration is required.**

#### Grab a Book and Sit Awhile

Looking for a good book to read this month? No problem! This month we once again are spotlighting several different ways you can locate recommended books in just about every genre.

(1) Up for a Challenge? -- Then the 52 Book Club might be right up your alley. This unique book club is part of an annual challenge -- read 52 books in 52 weeks. Not only is it simple to join, but it also definitely injects fun in selecting your next great read.

Each year the challenge is comprised of (surprise!) 52 different categories. The challenge is to read one book that fits under each of the categories. As the 52 Book Book Club says -- think of this as a giant book scavenger hunt. But, wait...these aren't your typical categories -- they are fun, imaginative and allow you to be as creative as you want to be as your fulfill the category task. For example, some of the categories this year are "A Pun In The Title", "Author's Last Name Is Also A First Name", "Cover Font Is In A Primary Color", "Plot Includes A Heist", "More Than A Million Copies Sold", and "Features a Magician". Definitely not the typical "mystery", "romance", or "single theme" category challenges you find elsewhere!

Not only will you have fun finding a book to read that fits into a category -- but you also may find yourself exploring new types of books and new authors that you never considered before.

- (2) Banish Those Winter Blues -- Cold, wind and snow have you down? Well, any book lover will tell you that curling up with a good book can do wonders to banish the winter chill. And, if you need help finding the perfect chill-busting read, look no further than the AARP. The organization has just released it's list of "37 of Winter's Best New Books to Get You Through The Chilly Season". The list includes thrillers, fiction and non-fiction selections, memoirs, mysteries and more by authors such as Scott Turow, Walter Mosley, Charmaine Wilkerson, Anne Tyler, Marianne Cronin, JoJo Myers, Josephine Baker, and Brooke Shields. Books in the series include: "A Kids Book About Adoption", "A Kids Book About School Shootings", "A Kids Book About Empathy", "A Kids Book About Blended Families", "A Kids Book About Becoming A Sibling", "A Kids Book About Voting", "A Kids Book About Periods", "A Kids Book About Racism", "A Kids Book About Imagination", etc. Authors of the books include Levar Burton, Billie Jean King, and Jessica Biel. - (4) Expand Your Horizons -- Looking for a slightly different take on book recommendations? Well, you should check out Waterstones, a UK-based bookstore, that also publishes a monthly list of book recommendations. You'll find many new and interesting titles to choose from that may not yet have made their way to U.S. book recommendation sites. The site's recent recommendations have included "Blue Sisters" by Coco Mellors (the bestselling author of Cleopatra & Frankenstein), "Hunted" by Abir Mukherjee (a riveting thriller), and even a children's book "Hunt for the Golden Scarab" by M.G. March 27, 2025 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join a hybrid (in-person or on Zoom) Mystery Book discussion of "Secret Hours" by Mick Herron. This mystery is about a hostile prime minister who launches the Monochrome inquiry -- investigating "historical overreaching" by the British Secret Service. Monochrome's mission was to ferret out any hint of misconduct by any MI5 officer, and allowed two civil servants unfettered access to all confidential information in the Service archives. Now the administration that created Monochrome has been ousted and the investigation is over. Until an MI5 case file appears containing the history of a classified operation in 1994 Berlin -- an operation that ended in tragedy and scandal, whose cover-up has rewritten 30 years of Service history.
