According to Karen..."This is a great adventure/mystery tale that is taken to further heights of enjoyment by the fact that it is based on a real-life person in history. Martha Ballard, a midwife in the 18th Century, delivered hundreds of babies in her lifetime and left a diary that immortalized her. The author has written this fictionalized version based on actual events of the time. Here we learn of 18th century day-to-day home life as well as the perils and struggles of the time. A very enjoyable and informative read."

In it Friss offers lively profiles of bookstores and their owners from the 18th century to today. His journey through time shows that books stores do more than sell books -- they are at the heart of a community and an important gathering place. Friss' survey takes you from Benjamin Franklin's Philadelphia print shop to book stores in Boston, New York, Chicago, Los Angeles, Miami, and more. Along the way you discover The Strand in New York City, The Old Corner Bookstore in Boston, Washington's Politics and Prose bookstore, and more. The story isn't always happy as many bookstores have shuttered their doors in recent years, but Friss' book provides an interesting look at the iconic role bookstores have played in American life.

September 26, 2024 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join a hybrid (in-person or on Zoom) discussion of "Anne Boleyn & Elizabeth I: The Mother and Daughter Who Forever Changed British History" by Tracy Borman. Anne Boleyn may be best known for losing her head, but Tudor expert Tracy Borman reveals, in a book that recasts British history, that Anne's greatest legacy lies in the path-breaking reign of her daughter, Elizabeth.
