To recognize Phyllis' lifetime of service, her commitment to our town, and her love of children, The Friends of the Township of Ocean is planning a special tribute.

We have designed a warm and inviting reading nook for the children's section of our library. The reading nook, aptly named "Mrs. Fyfe's Cozy Corner" will be located behind the children's librarian's desk.

The space will feature new bright cheery durable cushions, reupholstered small chairs, new carpeting, a fun story-time rug, fresh paint, colorful wall decor and more. In fact, thanks to the hard work and dedication of a team of Friends members, led by Barbara Saint John, and a wonderful group of professionals from our town's Department of Public Works, you'll notice that the transformation has already begun.

When finished, this space will create a welcoming reading area for our town's children and a fitting tribute to a remarkable woman who gave so much of her life to promote a love of reading to generations of young people.
