Updates from Our Cultural Collaborators

(1) The Township of Ocean Historical Museum -- The Township of Ocean Historical Museum will be closed on January 1, 2023 for New Year's Day. The museum will be open on all other Sundays in January from 1:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Local Archaeological Discoveries: The Township of Ocean Historical Museum is currently featuring a mini-exhibit of historical artifacts that were unearthed during a 2019-2020 archaeological study of the former site of the Eden Woolley House on the corner of Deal Road and Route 35. The study provides insights into the time period, settlement patterns, and activities of Native Americans who occupied the site. Among the artifacts uncovered are remnants of tools, shards of ceramic containers, burned rock and more. Be sure to visit our town's museum to view the exhibit and learn more about early life at the Eden Woolley Farmstead.

Happening Around Town

- (1) Life-Saving Reminder -- with cold weather settling in, it is a good time to familiarize yourself with how to protect you and your loved ones from the dangers of carbon monoxide gas. Between 2000 and 2019 carbon monoxide poisoning was the underlying cause of death for 275 New Jersey residents. And, in 2019 alone, 374 of our state's residents were treated in hospital emergency rooms for non-fire related accidental CO poisoning. - (2) Avoid Door-to-Door Salespeople -- If you are new to town, recently moved, or are just tired of door-to-door sales people disturbing you at home, don't forget you can list your address as a "No Knock Residence". Once you register, your address (but not your name) will be placed on a list that the town provides to any sales person issued a license to conduct door-to-door sales so they know not to stop at your home. Within 90 days of signing up, a decal will be mailed to you that also indicates your home is a "No Knock Residence" and you should display the decal on your front door. Registration takes just a few minutes and you can register

Helpful Tip

(1) Throughout this newsletter we often refer you to the Monmouth County Library's Eventkeeper site to register for one or more of the many programs being offered virtually or in-person by the Monmouth County Library system.

But, if you are having trouble remembering the date/time of the programs you've signed up for or wish there was an easy way to invite others to join you for the program...help is here thanks to some handy Eventkeeper features.

Now when you go to the Eventkeeper site to register for a program you also have the option of clicking on one (or more) of these buttons.

- A. Tell a Friend -- allows you to send an email to a friend about the program you've registered for and ask them to join you.
- **B. Remind Me** -- allows you to schedule a "reminder" email that will be sent to you 24 hours before the program begins so you don't forget.
- C. Add to Calendar -- allows you to add the program you've registered for to your electronic calendar.

Help Our Community -- Want to do your part to help our community? Here are simple ways you can make a difference

(1) Get Vaccinated -- Cases of COVID-19, flu, and RSV are rising which is resulting in thousands of hospitalizations nationwide. If you haven't already done so, it's not too late -- get both your flu shot and the new COVID-19 bivalent booster which offers stronger protections against severe illness and death from the Omicron sub-variants. (And, the CDC notes it is safe to get both vaccines at the same time.)

You can receive this booster as long as it has been two months since your most recent booster or primary vaccination series. And, some great news the bivalent booster is now available for children. The new Pfizer bivalent booster is recommended for all individuals 5 years and older. The new Moderna bivalent booster is recommended for those ages 6 and older. <u>Please note:</u> The federal government has brought back its free-at-home Covid tests program as part of its "winter preparedness plan. You can request four more FREE tests at: <u>www.COVIDtests.gov</u>.
