Updates from the Township of Ocean Library

(1) Ready...Set...READ!!!! The Monmouth County Library's summer reading program kicks off June 1, 2022 and runs through August 15, 2022. The theme this year is "Oceans of Possibilities".

As in the past, each registered participant will be reading towards an opportunity to win a prize. (The prize this year is an aluminum, BPA-free 20 oz. water bottle.) So sign up and start logging your books on June 1st to ensure your prize eligibility.

If you participated in the summer reading program in the past, you can use the same user name and password to register this year. No problem if you've forgotten your user name or password, you can simply reset it.

The summer reading program levels are: "Read To Me;" "Vacation Reading Club" (Grades K - 6 grade); "Teens" (Grades 6 - 12); and "Adults" (Age 18+).

Let's make Ocean the top library branch in number of books/ebook/audiobooks read this year. Be sure to log in ALL the books you read between June 1 and August 15, 2022. The more books you read, the better.

(2) Afternoon Movie -- Free movies return to our library branch on June 16, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. with the film "The Eyes of Tammy Faye". The film provides an intimate look at the rise, fall and redemption of televangelist Tammy Faye Baker. The film, which is rated PG-13, earned a Best Actress Oscar for Jessica Chastain as well as an Oscar for Best Achievement in Make-up. So mark your calendar for a movie afternoon at the library.

And, while you are at it, be sure to plan on attending next month's film too. On July 14, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. our branch will be showing the film "Dune". This film, adapted from the 1965 novel by Frank Herbert, tells the story of a noble family that becomes embroiled in a war for control of the galaxy's most valuable asset while its heir struggles with visions of a dark future. "Dune" is rated PG-13 and it won six Academy Awards (including for Best Achievement in Visual Effects, Best Sound, and Best Achievement in Cinematography).

- (3) A Song in Our Hearts -- We all have a song in our hearts with the news that the very popular Charlie's Band performances will be returning to our library branch in September! The first performance in over two years will take place in the Terner Gallery at the library on September 22, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. The performance will surely have your toes tapping. Be sure to add this event to your calendar so you don't miss out.
- (3) Children's Story Time is Back -- Children's story time has resumed at our branch, and weather permitting, some of these sessions will be held outdoors. Registration is required. - (2) The Art Council/Terner Gallery -- is excited is host an "Art in the Park Event" on June 4, 2022 from 10:00 a.m. 3:00 p.m. This outdoor art exhibit will be held on the paths near the library and museum. - (3) Spring is Definitely in Bloom -- thanks to the many volunteers at our town's Garden Club. The Garden Club will be hosting its annual outdoors plant swap on June 13, 2022 from 7:00 p.m. until approximately 8:30 p.m. at the Pavilion next to Fireman's Field. The concept is simple and fun -- for every item you bring, you can swap it for another. Just a few things to keep in mind if you plan on attending:

Happening Around Town

- (1) Tree Trimming -- Jersey Central Power & Light (JCP&L) is trimming trees across its service territory, including right here in Ocean Township. This effort, part of a \$40 million project, is one of the company's ongoing efforts to ensure service reliability, particularly with hot weather and summer storms just around the corner. Please note that all the books offered on this service are ebooks only and are from Amazon Publishing. June 8, 2022 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join this virtual book club to discuss **"Rose Code" by Kate Quinn.** In this book, you'll join three elite former female members of the Bletchley Park code breaking team as they reconnect years later to uncover a spy's dangerous agenda set against the backdrop of the royal wedding of Elizabeth and Phillip.

June 16, 2022 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join this virtual book club to discuss "The Code Breaker: Jennifer Doudna, Gene Editing, and the Future of the Human Race" by Walter Isaacson. Jennifer Doudna and her collaborators turned a curiosity of nature

into an invention that will transform the human race: a easy-to-use tool that can edit DNA. This invention opened a new word of medical miracles while raising many moral questions.

- (2) Hydration Happiness -- Join Rachel Tansey, MA, Family & Community Health Sciences, Rutgers Cooperative Extension of Monmouth County, on June 9, 2022 at 10:30 a.m. for a live Zoom presentation about the importance of keeping well hydrated. - (5) Explore Your Inner Artist -- You can put your inner artist on display during a live Zoom "Pointillism Art Seascape' class with artist Barbara Freiberg on June 14, 2022 at 10:30 a.m. You will learn how to create a pointillism art seascape inspired by Georges Seurat's artwork. You will learn how to sketch a seascape and then how to fill in your drawing using the pointillism art technique. To participate in this virtual art class you will need the following supplies: a regular pencil, eraser, one piece of 8x8 sketch or drawing paper, and assorted colors of markers (Crayola Super Tips Washable Markers 50 pack or similar markers.) Registration for this class opens at 9:00 a.m. on June 1, 2022.
- (6) Sounds of the Sixties -- Join the Simply Sixties Band on June 15, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. at the Monmouth County Library's Headquarters as they give a concert featuring the best songs and sounds of the 1960s. This blast from the past will include a wide variety of musical styles including the British Invasion, Motown, Rock & Roll, Soul, Surf, R&B and some Doo Wop as well. Doors open at 6:00 p.m. Seating is on a first come/first seated basis. No registration is required. "Saving seats" will not be permitted.
- (7) Sit In on a Lecture From the Comfort of Home -- The Monmouth County Library also sponsors interesting lectures. This month be sure to check out:
- June 7, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. -- "How Did They Die? -- A virtual lecture about the deaths of famous people by author and historian Greg Caggiano. The presentation examines (with plenty of dark humor) the circumstances surrounding certain historical figures' deaths, including Henry VII, Christopher Columbus, Napoleon, Marie Curie and more. PLEASE NOTE: In dissecting historical detail the presentation will get anatomically specific (historians who are faint of heart be forewarned!!) A question and answer session will follow the lecture.
- June 9, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. -- "Historic Wedding Dresses" -- this live Zoom lecture takes you on a journey of bridal fashion from the Victorian Era, mid-19th Century, the Edwardian Era, early 19th Century and current times. (Many of the dresses featured belonged to families local to the Shrewsbury, New Jersey, area.) Each dress reflects the the influences of its time -- whether that is the Jazz Age, World War I, World War II, and beyond. Not only will the history of the dresses be discussed by Don Burden and Robin Blair, president and vice president of the Shrewsbury Historical Society, but you'll also hear from Judi Buncher, a stylist and garment restorer, about the restoration process each dress underwent.
- June 16, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. -- "Memorializing African American History: Cemeteries, Monuments, and Markers" Join Dr. Linda Epps, president and CEO of 1804 Consultants, as she explores the changing public narrative of the United States

and the recognition of non-Anglo cultures that helped define what we know about the United States. Presented by the Monmouth County Historical Association, this lecture will also discuss how history impacts the way we see ourselves and others and how public markers influence our interpretation of our culture.

- June 22, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. Synagogues of Western Europe" -- Join author, architect and NYC tour guide, Oscar Israelowitz as he takes you on a virtual tour of the most beautiful Jewish synagogues of Western Europe. Your "tour" will take you to Italy, Switzerland, Germany, France, Holland, and the United Kingdom. This is one tour you definitely won't want to miss.
